Dear Alumni and Friends,

With the close of the 2021-2022 academic year last month, I am writing to share some of the good news from our department's many successes over the past year.

Since our last newsletter, our faculty were very fortunate to have received several awards. **Dr. Christopher Crawford** was awarded the Outstanding Graduate Student Mentoring Award this spring and also received one of six 2021 **Great Teacher Awards**. Dr. Crawford studies fundamental symmetries in nuclear physics and finds ways to incorporate research in classroom assignments. The Graduate School presented **Dr. Susan Gardner** with the 2022 **Albert D. and Elizabeth H. Kirwan Memorial Prize** for outstanding contributions to original research. Over the course of her distinguished 27-year career at UK, Dr. Gardner has developed an international reputation, bringing considerable attention to our department and UK.

We also celebrate the many successes of our undergraduate and graduate students. Gabija Ziemyte and Richard Lai were recognized as the Outstanding Junior and Senior, respectively, at the department's Awards Ceremony on April 29th. Additionally, Sheng-Chieh Lin, advised by **Dr. Yuanyuan Su**, was named as the recipient of the **Keith B. MacAdam Graduate Excellence Fellowship** in Physics and Astronomy.

The department successfully carried out a faculty search in theoretical condensed matter physics with a focus on quantum materials. Dr. Chunli Huang, who is currently a postdoc at Los Alamos National Laboratory, will join our department in January 2023. Dr. Huang's research focuses on understanding topology, magnetism, and superconductivity in Moire materials.

Finally, I am pleased to report that, following four years of physical separation, our theoretical physicists and astronomers will vacate Blazer Dining Hall and rejoin our experimental physicists in the Chemistry-Physics Building. We are excited to have our department reunited this summer as the **renovation of the Chemistry-Physics Building's third floor** nears completion.

I hope you enjoy this newsletter, and I look forward to hearing from you. We would be pleased to welcome you for a visit of the renovated Chemistry-Physics Building.






