
Research Experience For Undergraduates (REU) May 25 – Jul 31, 2026

The detection of small deviations from exact symmetry is a powerful probe of new physical laws. Researchers at the University of Kentucky are searching for the electric dipole moment of the neutron, "dark matter" contributions to Maxwell's equations, effects of broken time-reversal symmetry in topological heterostructures, non-radial pulsation modes of variable stars, and more!
